Green Oaks

Opened about 1940 and closed about 1945

The Green Oaks theatre had 150 seats.

Venus

Opened about 1965 and closed about 1970

The Venus theatre had 400 seats.

Verdun

Opened about 1950 and closed about 1960

The Verdun theatre had 400 seats and it was opened 4 days a week, it was owned by Milton Smallfan

SUMMERSIDE

Capitol

Opened about 1935 and twinned about 1980 and closed 2000 H.E. Gaudet owned the Capitol between 1950-1975, which had 560 seats In 1980, the Capitol was owned by Francis Parry and had 560 seats in 2 cinemas.



Regent

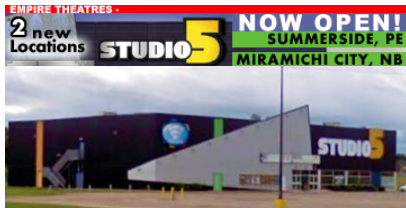
Opened about 1950 and closed about 1960 and reopened about 1980 and closed shortly after. G.R. Pope owned the Regent, which had 526 seats, in 1980 Francis Parry owned the Regent.

Opened about 1950 and closed about 1985 L.W. Ellis and in 1980 Parkview Tourist Corp. owned the Starlite Drive-In which has space for 200 cars.

Parkview Drive-In

Opened about 1960 and closed about 1970 and reopened again 1990 and closing shortly after, reopened 1992 as Brackley Drive-In Parkview Tourist Corp. owned the Parkview Drive-In, which had space for 300 cars.

Prince Edward

Opened about 1935 and closed about 1955 Famous Players owned the Prince Edward, which had 1050 seats.

Prince Edward 2

Opened about 1979 and closed about 1990 Maritime and in later years Atlantic Theatres and Empire theatres owned the Prince Edward Twin.
