Menard and in about 1970 World Wide
Special Attractions owned the National,
which had 422 seats.

Palace **CLOSED**

Opened about 1950 and closed about
1980 Dr. J.E. Gibord and in about 1965 R.
Menard and in about 1970 World Wide
Special Attractions owned the Palace,
which had 600 seats.

SHAWINIGAN

Auditorium **CLOSED**

Opened about 1935 and closed about
1965 G. Champagne and in about 1960
Shawinigan Cinemas Inc owned the
Auditorium, which had 600 seats.

Capitol **CLOSED**

Opened about 1954 and closed about
1980 G. Champagne and in about 1960
Shawinigan Cinemas Inc and in 1970 World
Wide Special Attractions and in about
1980 Cinemas de la Mauricie owned the
Capitol, which had 500 seats.

Ciné-Parc Lavolette **CLOSED**

5 miles north on Biernans

Opened about 1975 and closed about
2000 A. Gaudrault and in 1986 Lavolette
1986 Inc. owned this drive-in, which had
space for 650 cars.



Cinéma Biermans **OPEN**

1553 Boul. Biermans
Opened about 1994, burned 1998 and reopened with 8 screens 1999 Claude Bellerive owns this theatre.

Opened about 1955 and closed about 1960
J. Rosseau owned this theatre, which had 500 seats

Colonial **CLOSED**

Opened about 1950 and closed about 1985
The Colonial theatre had 306 seats and it was owned by: 1950 R. Lalonde, 1960 A. G. Caouette, 1970 R. Rosseau, 1975 C. Auger, 1980 Yvan Comtois

Plessis **CLOSED**

Opened about 1965 and closed about 1980
R. Rosseau and in about 1980 E. Comtois owned the Plessis theatre, which had 500 seats,

The Laurentien theatre had 250 seats and it was owned by T. Yanakis

Municipal **CLOSED**

Opened about 1950 and closed about 1950

The Municipal theatre had 250 seats and it was owned by T. Yanakis

St. Gabriel **CLOSED**

Opened about 1945 and closed about 1945

MRC NICOLET-YAMASKA NICOLET

Gala **CLOSED**

?1945-?1985

The Gala theatre had 375 seats and it was owned by: 1950 G. Allard, 1975 Jane-Yves Bouchard

PIERREVILLE

Ciné Film **CLOSED**

Opened about 1950 closed about 1955

This theatre had 300 seats and it was owned by: 1950 A. Lapierre, 1955 G. Langevin

Lapierier **CLOSED**

Opened about 1940 closed about 1945
The Lapierier theatre had 300 seats.

AKA: Rialto, Le Baronet, Midi Minuit
323 Forges
1972-1984

Cinema Investments owned the Midi-Minuit, which had 350 seats



Rialto **CLOSED**

AKA: Le Baronet, Midi-Minuit
323 Forges
526 seats.

- * Early 1930's opened as Rialto by Famous Players (United Amusements)
- * 1963 renamed Le Baronet as it is taken over by B. Le Have
- * 1972 renamed Midi-Minuit as it is taken over by Cinema Investments and switched to adult movies.
- * 1984 closed

A. Bellefeuille owned this theatre, which had 1000 seats and was opened 2-4 days a week.
