Famed director Francis Ford Coppola is joining forces with a group of investors to restore the Uptown Theater in Napa, California. The art deco movie house, built in 1937, will be renovated and restored and will add live entertainment to its existing repertoire of activities.

Currently divided into four screens, the theater will be returned to single screen status and will be able to seat up to 900. The restoration will also include adding a cafe and, possibly, a restaurant to the facility. Coppola will serve as the Art Director for the project.
